Acts 9.2 "... if he found any belonging to the Way ($\tau \tilde{\eta} \varsigma \delta \delta \tilde{\delta} \tilde{\delta} \tilde{\delta}$), both men and women, he might bring them bound to Jerusalem."

Acts 19.9 "But when some were hardened, and believed not, but spake evil of that way (τὴν ὀδὸν) before the multitude, he departed from them..."




Keys

"'Priesthood keys are the authority God has given to priesthood [holders] to direct, control, and govern the use of His priesthood on earth' [Handbook 2: Administering the Church [2010], 2.1.1]. Every act or ordinance performed in the Church is done under the direct or indirect authorization of one holding the keys for that function. As Elder M. Russell Ballard has explained, 'Those who have priesthood keys ... literally make it possible for all who serve faithfully under their direction to exercise priesthood authority and have access to priesthood power'

Base and Meridian

Often overlooked, the Base and Meridian is a small statuette on the southeast corner of Temple Square. On August 3, 1847, this location was fixed as the point from which all city streets were named and numbered.

Salt Lake City's grid system originates from here, making the coordinates 0 East, 0 West, 0 North, and 0 South, according to the system. This location was chosen during the original survey of "the Great Salt Lake" after Brigham Young designated the centralized temple site on July 28, 1847. The grid system is still used today in almost every city and town across Utah.

Make sure to look down as you're walking by — the Base and Meridian is a great place to stop and snap a photo.

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
